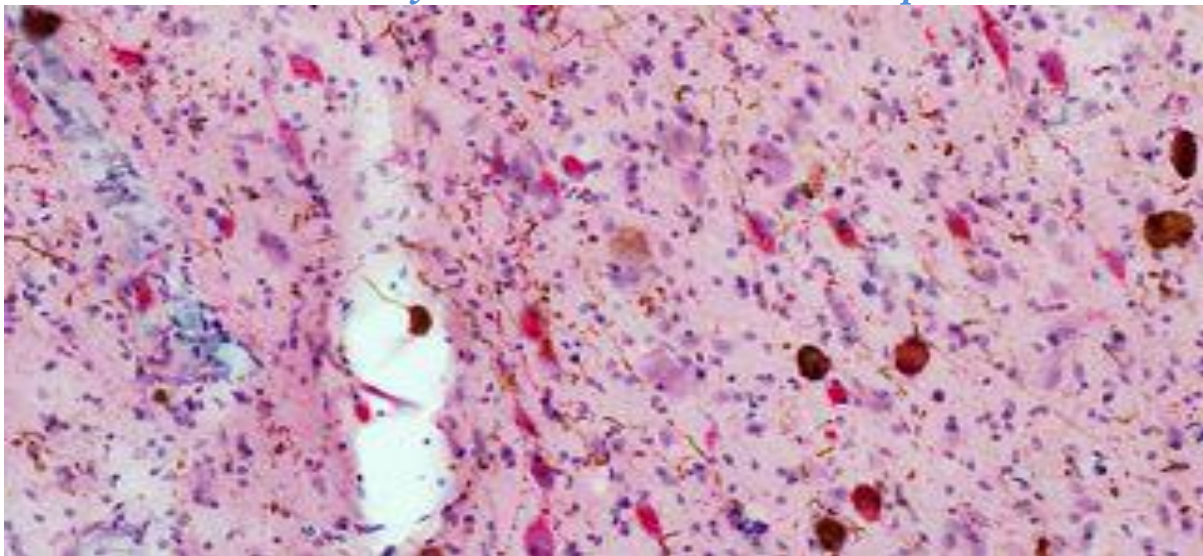

1. Management of cancer-associated anemia with erythropoiesis-stimulating agents: ASCO/ASH clinical practice guideline update

Use of erythropoiesis-stimulating agents (ESAs) to manage anemia raises hemoglobin (Hgb) levels and reduces the need for RBC transfusions, but increases the risk of thromboembolic events. For more details, click on the below link
